Project Access:

Local effort to provide access for the uninsured by building a network of providers who will donate care to a discrete number of new patients per time period

All services that the provider typically needs in his/her specialty are also donated

Relies on the generosity of physicians and the support of their colleagues
70 efforts nationally

Each is unique to the needs of its local area.
